Welcome to our Burton Town Trail, it will take about 90 mins it is a circular Trail from the Middleway Carpark on Guild Street. It is suitable for adults and children you could create a team with family/friends. The Trail is accessible for all; where there are steps there are sloping paths nearby.

The Trail is based around the Town Centre and will show you features of sculptures, architecture, and history.

There are 5 green National Forest information signs like this one, full of interesting facts about the history of Burton on Trent and they will help with some of the answers; so; have a quick read of them as you go around the Trail.

Let's Go

Starting Point = Parking at the Middleway Retail Carpark (4 hours free parking) Guild Street, DE14 1NQ - See **START** position on the Map on the Back Page

1. Walk towards Worthington Walk by the Cinema and find the Barrel Sculpture on the pavement.

- What is the name of this sculpture?
- When was it created?

2. Continue along Worthington Walk towards High Street to find the strange blocks with faces

- What were the craftsmen called?
- Who was the earliest known craftsman?

Walk to the crossroads on High Street, and cross over to look at the green National Forest Information Sign on the corner of the Bass Buildings. Read this sign it has some key information for one of the next questions.

3. Cross over the road to find a Burton Civic Society Plaque on the side of a large building, if you walk around the front you will find its name and symbol over the doorway

- Which famous business was situated here?
- What does the shield hold?
- Who lived here? ALLIMOTOWN WRITHING

4. Walk down towards the river and stop in front of the tall Water Tower

- How tall do you think this tower is in metres?
- When was it built?

Selfie Challenge—Take a Selfie of yourself with the Water Tower

- 5. Turn around to face the river, ahead of you is a tall sculpture
- What is this sculpture called?
- Who was the sculptor



- 6. Walk in front of the library building to see the tall Waterfront Sculpture
- Which Burton Charity's name is on the base?

Go down the steps (or slope to the far right) to the **Marmite Jar Sculpture**, situated on the grass near the play area.

Selfie Challenge—Marmite Love It or Hate It?

Walk towards the Black & White Iron Bridge, this is leads to Andressey Island.

7. Look at the bridge

- Who were the engineers of this bridge?
- Which year was it built?
- How many white and red flowers are there on the inside of the bridge?

8. Continue over the bridge and read the green National Forest Information Sign, look around for the Sculpture by Hattie Coppard

- What materials were used to create this sculpture?
- Why are eyes connected to St Modwen?

9. Return over the bridge to find the next Green National Forest Information Sign by the Riverbank. Then walk across the park.

- Who is this park in memory of?
- What do you think this was before becoming a park?

10. Look around the park and buildings that are visible from the park

- Find a Royalty Link?
- What is this walkway called?

11. Look at the old buildings to the right-hand side and find the school building

• When was the original school built?

Continue walking towards the church, at the entrance you will see another green National Forest Information Sign about the local area.

12. Continue towards the Market Hall, have a good look around this building, look up at the decorations too.

- Which animal guards the side doorway?
- Which king gave Burton a Charter?
- Which year was the first chartered market held?
- How many faces are there on the front of the building?

Walk towards the College and find the Sculpture, it's near the junction with Abbey Street opposite the Leopard Inn

Selfie Challenge—Take a Selfie of yourself with this Sculpture.

13. Turn around and walk down Lichfield Street towards the junction with New Street, you will not be able to miss the giant Malt Shovel sculpture.

- What is the chemical equation on the paving stones?
- What do the tiny symbols represent?

Selfie Challenge—Take a Selfie of yourself with the Malt Shovel

14. Walk towards the Coopers Square Shopping Centre, stopping to look at the strange door on the left of the shopping centre doors

- What was the old doorway used for?
- What is the date on the doorway?

15. Go into **Coopers Square Shopping Centre** and continue straight until you reach the Cooper Statute in the centre square area. (If Open)

- Who was the Statue created by?
- Which year?
- Why were barrels so important to Burton's history?

Selfie Challenge—Take a Selfie with the Cooper Statue

Walk past the Cooper Statue towards Station Street, when you go out go out of the shopping centre, cross over the road, and walk along Station Street towards the junction with Guild Street.

16. Cross over the Junction towards George Street there is another green National Forest Information Sign to read. Look around this area.

• Which Energy Company used to have its shop in one of the buildings?

17. Walk down George Street and look at the building on your right-hand side, this is the back of the cinema

- What type of entertainment did it use to host?
- Which famous silent movie star visited this building?

18. Look at the Trinity Building in the Corner

- What was this building originally called?
- Which ancient civilization has been copied in the Pilasters, Columns? A Greece B Roman or C Egypt

19. Walk down to the building on the corner of Guild Street/George Street

• Count the faces in the stonework decorations.

20. Turn the corner onto Guild Street, heading North, on the far side is St Mary and St Modwen's Church, look at the stone figures

What is St Modwen holding?

Carry on walking towards Middleway Retail Park entry point and this is the end of the Trail.
